#### Fees

Daily fee of \$87.72

Incursion day fee of \$107.22

The additional cost of \$19.50 for incursion days will be charged per child even if your child doesn't participate.

\* Our School holiday program qualifies for the Federal Government's Child Care Subsidy (CCS). The CCS is based on each family's circumstances, but may reduce your OSHC fees to as low as \$20 daily. The amount of CCS you can get depends on your circumstances and the hourly rate cap set by the Government. To find out if you are eligible, simply log into your MyGov and complete your CCS Assessment.

Please note: Child/ren must attend the first and last day of care in order to receive CCS.

#### How to book

- 1. Read through fee and cancelation policy
- Complete an <u>Enrolment form</u> if you are new to OSHC or holiday care or if you're details have changed. There's no need to complete this if you have enrolled with us previously and your details remain the same.
- 3. Complete **Booking and Payment form**

#### Meals

Please note: families are responsible for providing lunch and snacks. Windermere will supply breakfast, afternoon tea, and special lunch days.

#### Absences

All bookings are charged prior to attendance. This secures your child's spot in the Holiday Program. Staffing is based on attendance. If your child is sick or not attending a booked session, please call and notify the program before 8.30am. Please review the cancellation policy with regards to if a credit can be applied, as in some instances credit may not be able to be applied.

#### Age to attend

To qualify for enrolment in Windermere's Holiday Program children must be attending primary school (in that year).

#### Priority of access

Windermere's Holiday Program is offered to the general community.

Priority of access will be given to:

- 1. Children at risk of serious abuse or neglect and families in crisis.
- 2. Children of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.
- 3. Children attending the host school and other Windermere OSHC Schools.
- 4. Children residing within the LGA.

#### Children's Health and Safety

Please help us keep the program safe by:

Keeping any children who are sick at home.

**NOTE** If your child has a medical condition they can only attend the Holiday Program if the Action Plan, Risk Minimisation Plan and Communication Plan have been completed and submitted prior to attendance. Any medication associated with the action plans must be brought to the program each day they attend. If medication is not supplied on the day, the child may not attend the program. This rule applies for all diagnosed medical conditions.
