



School Attendance Support Program.

Cranbourne, Clyde and Clyde North

The School Attendance Support Program (SASP) is funded by Communities for Children Cranbourne and supports families to improve school engagement and attendance.

Who is SASP for

Families where there is a child who attends a primary school in Cranbourne, Clyde and Clyde North who are experiencing signs of school disengagement.

When to engage with SASP

The earlier you can seek out support for children who are showing indicators for school disengagement the better.

Early indications of school disengagement may include:

- Child requesting not to go to school and becoming distressed about attending.
- Showing signs of distress at school.
- Spending more time in wellbeing.
- Increased levels of anxiety and worry.
- Peer issues, social isolation or bullying.
- Feeling sick (headaches, stomach aches).
- Increased amount of time off for illness.
- Changes in sleep and morning routine.

How can SASP help

SASP assists families to understand the barriers to their child's school engagement and works collaboratively to support early and sustainable change.

A SASP worker will Listen and get to know families to support families with a tailored approach to suit each individual family's needs and goals. A SASP worker may:

- Help formulate a shared understanding of what the barriers to school attendance and engagement are.
- Provide practical parenting strategies, resources and information.
- Support the development of family routines, structure and boundaries.
- Work one on one with children to promote their wellbeing.
- Build positive connections between families and schools.
- Help develop return to school plans with families and schools.
- Connect families in with other useful support services available.

SASP is a free and voluntary support service and accepts referrals from families, schools and other community services.
